REGIONAL GUIDANCE OF ASYLUM SEEKERS

→ WHAT IS REGIONAL GUIDANCE?

● Regional guidance is an **offer of accommodation** made to you when the region you are in is not able to accommodate you.

You can then be **supported** in another **region of France** for the duration of your asylum application.

● You are **an asylum seeker**? You do not have stable accommodation? Whether you are an **isolated person** or a **family**, whatever your **age** or **nationality**, you can benefit from guidance to **accommodation in the region**.

→ AM I CONCERNED?



● You have **health problems**? Throughout France, medical centres, hospitals and specialised centres will be able to take care of you.

If, despite this, you think that you are not eligible for regional guidance, OFII will ask you to **produce documentary evidence**.

→ HOW TO BENEFIT FROM REGIONAL GUIDANCE?



● Everything takes place during your **interview with OFII**, at the one-stop shop for asylum seekers (GUDA). If you do not have accommodation, an OFII officer can **offer you regional guidance**.

OFII will then inform you about your **host region** and the **address of the host centre** to which you should go. OFII will give you a **transport ticket** to enable you to go there within 5 days.

● You can refuse the regional guidance offer. If you refuse it, OFII will not offer you other accommodation and you will not receive the asylum seeker's allowance.



● When you arrive at the temporary host centre, you will be provided with **accommodation** and **social and administrative support** for one month.

During this period, you will be directed to an **accommodation centre** in the same region, in a reception centre for asylum seekers or in emergency accommodation for asylum seekers, until the end of the examination of your asylum application (by OFPRA or the CNDA).

You will be **domiciled** in your **host region**, within your accommodation structure or, if you do not join it, within the first host facility located in the host department.

WHAT KIND OF SUPPORT DO I BENEFIT FROM IN MY HOST REGION?



● Within the framework of the regional guidance, you will have to **stay in that region** for the duration of the examination of your asylum application, otherwise you will lose your rights to material host conditions.

With the exception of summonses to OFPRA and CNDA, travel outside your host region will be subject to **authorisation**.
